Our Story

In 2014, Kirk in the Hills launched a capital campaign, raising funds to be used, in part, for outreach in the Kirk's neighboring community of Pontiac, Michigan. Soon after, a committee was formed to decide how the funds would be used, ultimately deciding on an El Sistema-inspired music program. The Kirk has a long history of musical excellence as well as a dedication to supporting the Pontiac community. Accent Pontiac was the perfect fit

In April 2016, Dan Trahey, founder and Artistic Director of OrchKids, an El Sistema-inspired program in Baltimore, joined the team as a consultant. Trahey helped to guide Accent Pontiac through its initial stages, including the securing of Walt Whitman Elementary School as our partner in the Pontiac School District. Tina Rowan was hired as the founding Artistic/Program Director in September 2016, and Accent Pontiac began its soft launch phase. Accent Pontiac's pilot program launched on January 10, 2017, serving approximately 190 students at Walt Whitman.

In September 2017, Accent Pontiac received its exemption letter from the Internal Revenue Service to be recognized as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt organization. The Kirk will remain committed to being actively engaged in fundraising and providing office space and administrative support.

In the upcoming years, Accent Pontiac hopes to support all schools in the Pontiac School District, starting by opening a second elementary school site in the 2018-2019 school year.

Accent Pontiac Important Dates and Performances

Event Highlights

Soft Launch—Before launching regular programming in January, Accent Pontiac provided several musical experiences for students at Walt Whitman during the fall of 2016. Students went on a field trip to the Detroit Symphony Orchestra, participated in an interactive Orff instrument petting zoo, and heard several guest artists perform at Walt Whitman.

November Intersession—During intersession week in November 2016, Accent Pontiac brought two guest teaching artists to work with the first, second, and third graders at Walt Whitman. Students participated in an intensive, week-long bucket band workshop, learning to play bucket band songs as well as creating their own songs. After four days of rehearsal, all students performed for the school community on Friday.

March Intersession—During intersession week in March 2017, Accent Pontiac brought three guest teaching artists to work with the first, second, third, and sixth graders at Walt Whitman. This intensive, week-long workshop focused on bucket band, choir, and brass band. After four days of rehearsal, all students performed for the school community on Friday.

Let the Music Begin Benefit Auction—In May 2017, Kirk in the Hills sponsored the Let the Music Begin auction, with all proceeds benefitting Accent Pontiac. Over 150 community members attended to watch Accent Pontiac students perform outside of Walt Whitman for the first time and raised over \$25,000 for the program.


End of Year Showcase—In June 2017, all Accent Pontiac bucket band and brass students performed at an End of Year Assembly for the Walt Whitman school community, family members, Pontiac community members, and Kirk in the Hills members.

Summer Program—Nineteen Accent Pontiac students participated in a week-long, full-day summer program at Kirk in the Hills. Each day, students took classes in bucket band, brass, movement, and creative composition. At the end of the week, students performed what they had learned in the summer program for their families as well as Pontiac and Kirk community members.


