Musical Growth

Clearly articulated assessment rubrics assess Accent Pontiac student musical learning.

- <u>100%</u> of students are performing at a moderately high to high level in rhythm goals.
- 100% of students are performing at a moderately high to high level in note range goals.
- 81% of students are performing at a moderately high to high level based on their overall musical goals.

Academic Growth

Attendance and Standardized Test data show Accent Pontiac positively impacts student academics.

- 100% of partner school staff say students look forward to coming to school to participate in Accent Pontiac activities.
- The percentage of 2nd grade Accent Pontiac students reaching their NWEA Math growth goal is 25% higher as compared to their peers.
- The percentage of 3rd grade Accent Pontiac students reaching their NWEA Math growth goal is <u>20%</u> higher as compared to their peers.

School Climate

Surveys show partner school staff to be very positive about Accent Pontiac.

- <u>100%</u> say Accent Pontiac supports positive school culture.
- <u>100%</u> say Accent Pontiac offers quality activities to Pontiac students.
- 89% say Accent Pontiac has provided more opportunities for musical performances than previous years.

In 2014, the Kirk launched a capital campaign, raising start-up funding and giving rise to Accent Pontiac. Soon after, Accent Pontiac received 501(c)(3) tax exempt status, allowing our program to continue to grow to serve more students in Pontiac. Today, Kirk in the Hills continues to be a vital source of funding and support for Accent Pontiac. Our intent is that this partnership will deepen providing everexpanding opportunities for Pontiac students.
